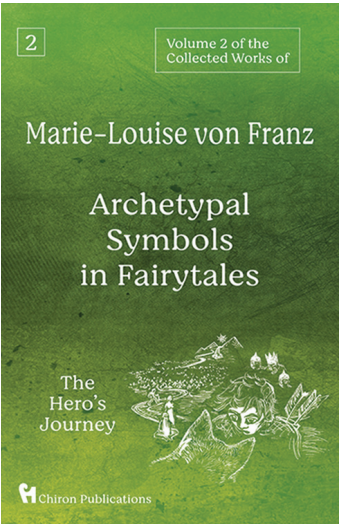

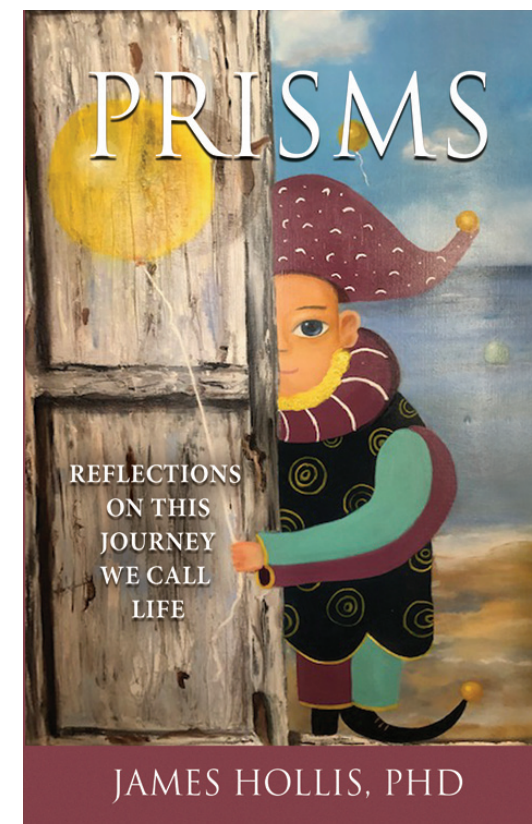


The Broken Mirror
